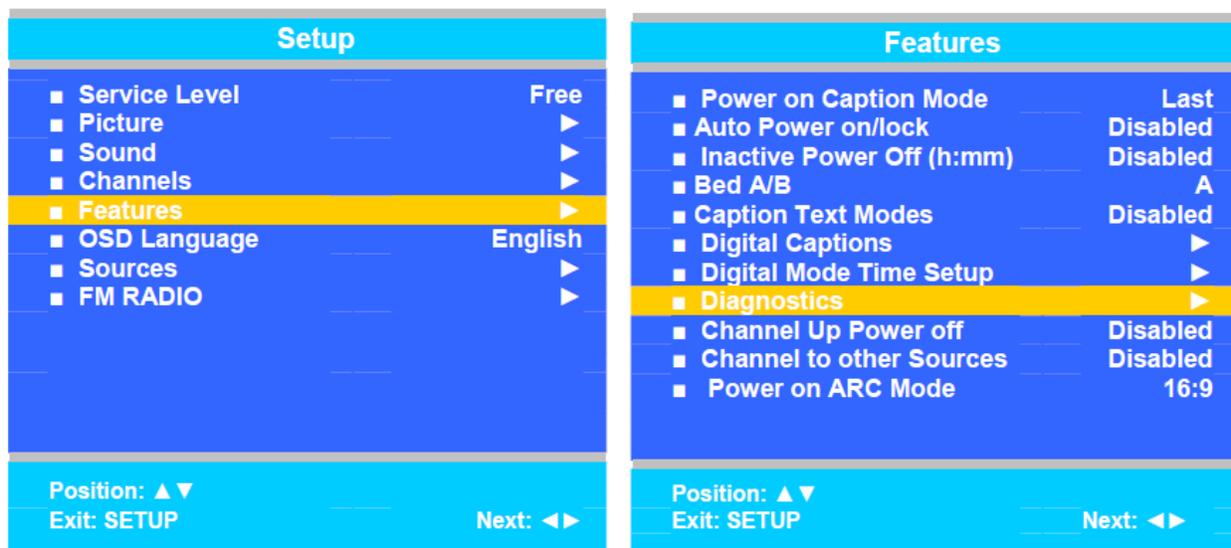

Firmware

Check the TV's main firmware by using a programming remote, part number PD108-420. It must have at least version 2.39 or higher to be compatible with the computer module.



1. Press SETUP to enter the Setup menu.
2. From the Setup menu, press CH▲ or CH▼ to highlight Features.
3. Press VOL▶ to select it.
4. Press the CH▲ or CH▼ to highlight Diagnostics.
5. Press VOL◀ or VOL▶ to select it.
6. Press the SETUP button to exit.

NOTE: The Diagnostics menu is read only, but each item can be highlighted by pressing CH▲ or CH▼.

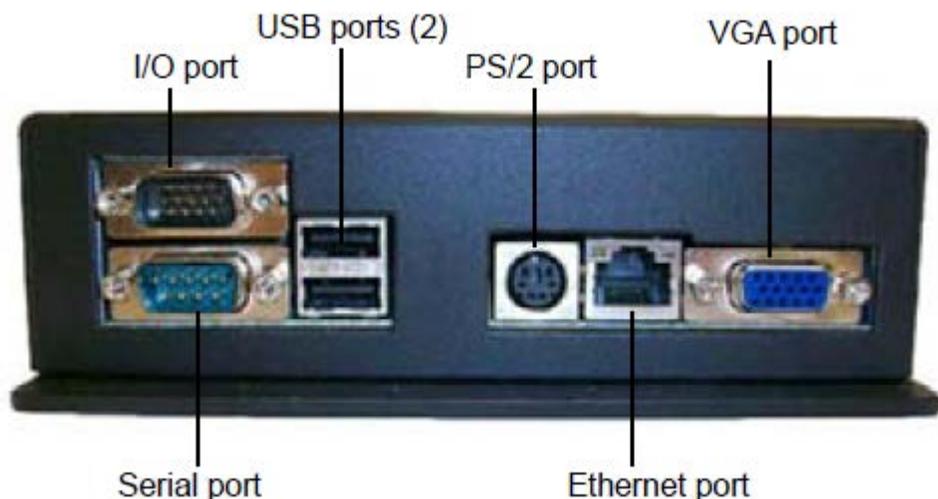
NOTE: The firmware can be upgraded. Please contact PDi Communication technical support for information about updating the firmware.

Connection Ports

The computer module has several ports for connecting hardware.



I/O and VGA ports: These ports will be used to connect to the TV. (See Computer Module Installation on page 6).

Serial port: You can connect devices with a serial connector, such as printers, to this port.

USB ports: You can connect different types of USB-based hardware to either of these two ports, such as mice, keyboards, and MP3 players. External CD/DVD-ROM drives may also be connected.

PS/2 port: You can connect a PS/2 mouse, or keyboard to this port.

Ethernet: The Ethernet port may be used to connect to a local network.

WiFi: Some models are equipped with 802.11n for wireless networking capabilities.

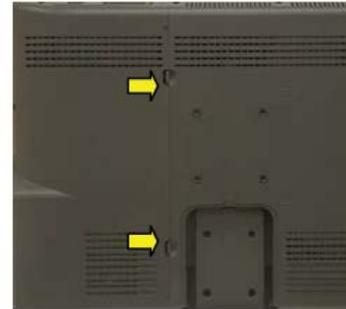
Computer Module Installation:

The computer module for the P26/P32/P40 TV is designed to mount in the top slot in the rear of the TV set, allowing easy access to several standard computer ports. (See the connection ports section on page 5).



WARNING: Unplug the power cord from the AC power before installing module. Failure to remove power will result in equipment damage.

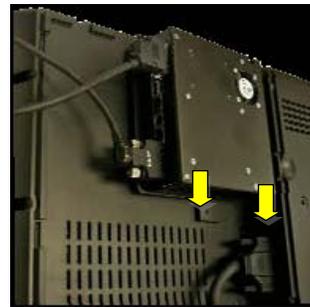
1. Unplug the power cord from the TV or at the wall outlet.
2. Remove the side panel by pressing on the two plastic tabs.



3. Connect the I/O and VGA connectors into their respective ports on the computer module and tighten the thumb screws on both connectors.



4. Slide the computer module into the top position so the ports are facing the outer edge of the side of the TV.



5. Line up the screw hole on the module with the screw hole that is just above the vents.
6. Use a Phillips screwdriver to secure the module with the screw that came with it.



7. Connect the other end of the cable to one of the connectors on the side of the TV. Tighten with the thumb screws on both sides of the cable.

NOTE: It is easier to connect the cable to the lower connector on the TV.



Attaching Panel Accessory

The computer module comes with a panel accessory that has a USB connector and an Ethernet connector. The panel accessory allows the computer module to be used with the rear panel mounted to the TV.



NOTE: The following instructions assume that you have mounted the computer module and the rear panel is still removed.

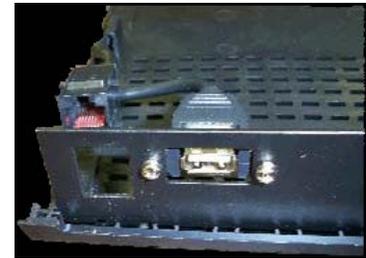
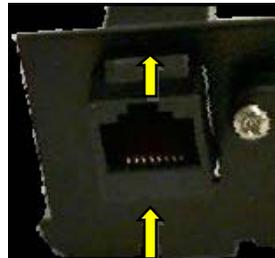
1. Use a Phillips screwdriver to remove the panel accessory that is at the bottom of the panel.



2. Attach the panel accessory that came with the computer module by inserting it in the slot where the other panel accessory was located.



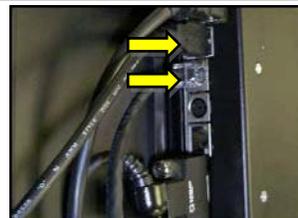
3. Remove the Ethernet connector from the panel accessory by pressing up on the bottom clip and pushing the Ethernet connector out of the back of its slot. Be sure to secure the panel accessory and panel with your other hand.



NOTE: This step can also be done before the panel accessory is inserted into the slot on the panel.

4. Now that the Ethernet connector is removed, secure the panel accessory to the panel with the two screws you removed from the other panel accessory.
5. Reinsert the Ethernet connector into its slot on the panel accessory.

6. Connect the USB and Ethernet cables to one of their corresponding ports on the computer module.



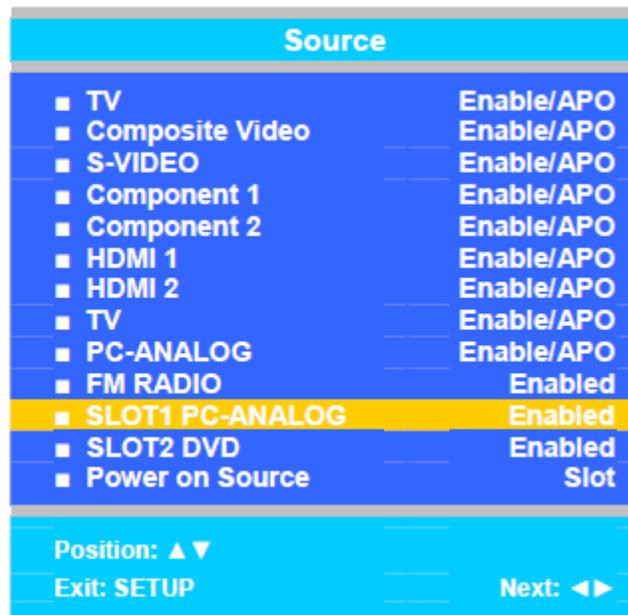
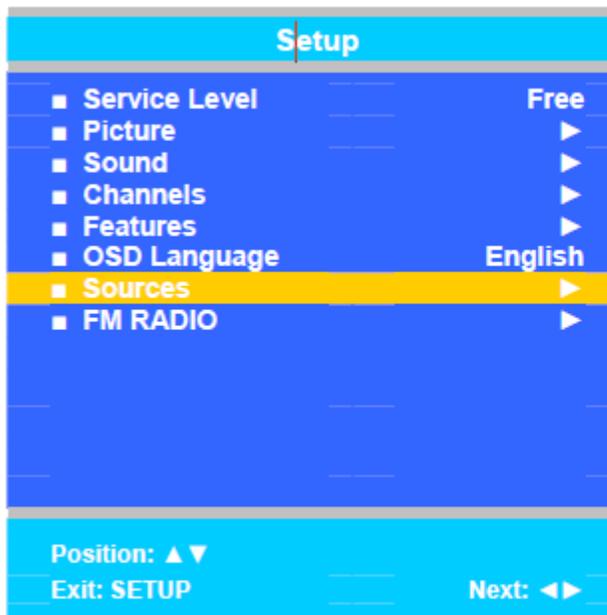
7. Place the rear panel on the back of the TV. On models that have screws, secure it with two screws,

Enabling/Disabling Computer Module

The TV's SLOT 1 OR SLOT 2 need to be enabled before the computer can be booted. "PC-ANALOG" will be to the right of the SLOT menu item you need to enable. Follow the below procedure with a programming remote, part number PD108-420.



The computer module must be installed before following this procedure.



1. Power the TV.
2. Press SETUP on the remote.
3. Press CH▲ or CH▼ to highlight Sources
4. Press the VOL▶ button to select it.
5. Press the CH▲ or CH▼ to highlight SLOT1 or SLOT 2 (the one with PC-ANALOG next to it).
6. Press VOL▶ to change the source status to Enabled/APO.
7. Press the SETUP button to exit.

Initial Setup

1. Be sure the SLOT 1 or 2 PC-ANALOG source is enabled under the SETUP menu. (See the Enabling/Disabling computer module setting section on page 8)
2. To switch from TV to computer mode, press the TV/AV button, located on the right side of the TV or on the programming remote, PD108-420, until the SLOT 1 or 2 PC-ANALOG source is active.
3. The computer will boot to the desktop.

NOTE: A mouse or a keyboard must be connected to the computer in order to operate it.



NOTE: The P26/32/40 computer module does not come with virus-protection software preinstalled. PDi Communication Systems, Inc. strongly recommends installing virus-protection software



NOTE: Default user accounts are not restricted in any way. PDi Communication Systems, Inc. strongly recommends creating a user account with limited privileges.



NOTE: Be sure that Windows Firewall is enabled to help protect against internet threats.

Understanding Default Computer Accounts

A “**pdi user**” account has been setup as the Administrative account. The computer will boot into a default account: “**user**”. This account has no restrictions imposed on it. It is recommended that you use a third party utility to assist in imposing further restrictions on public accounts.



NOTE: The “**user**” account does not have a password.
The “**pdi user**” account has a password: “**computer123**”

Turning Off Computer

Windows XP will go through a shutdown process automatically when the TV is turned off.

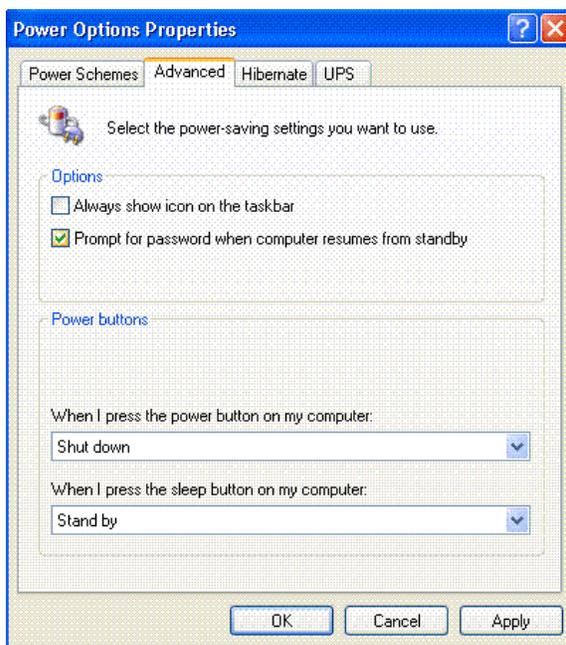
Before pressing the power button, check to be sure the computer is set to shut down when the power button is pressed. Use these steps to check this.

In Category View

1. Click the Start button.
2. Click Control Panel.
3. Click Performance and Maintenance at the bottom of the first column of icons.
4. Under the “or pick a Control Panel icon” section, click Power Options.
5. Select the “Advanced” tab in the “Power Option Properties” window.
6. If it is set, then Shut down will appear in the “When I press the power button on my computer” dropdown menu in the “Power buttons” section. If “Shut down” is not the selected item, then select it from the dropdown menu.
7. Click OK.
8. Close out of all open windows.

IN CLASSIC VIEW

1. Click the Start button.
2. Click Control Panel.
3. Click Power Options Icon.
4. Select the “Advanced” tab in the “Power Option Properties” window.
5. If it is set, then Shut down will appear in the “When I press the power button on my computer” dropdown menu in the “Power buttons” section. If Shut down is not the selected item, then select it from the dropdown menu.
6. Click OK
7. Close out of all open windows.

NOTE: A forced shutdown will occur 2 minutes after turning off the TV if Windows has not automatically shut down before then.

NOTE: Be sure the computer has shut down before removing power from the TV. This can be done by manually shutting down Windows, instead of relying on the automatic shutdown.

Restoring Windows to Factory Default

If the operating system becomes corrupt, it can be restored to factory defaults.

Warning: This process will destroy all data and settings on the disk. It cannot be undone.

1. Attach a USB keyboard to the computer
2. Turn on the computer and within the first 5 seconds, select "Boot Recovery Image".
3. At the login prompt enter the username "pdisystem" and password "computer123".
4. Click "Login".
5. If the username and password are accepted, then click "Start System Restore Process".
6. Follow the prompts to continue the restoration process.
7. After the computer reboots, it will be reset to factory defaults.
